

Reception News

This week we are off topic slightly as we take part in World Nursery Rhyme Week. Each day we will learn a nursery rhyme and there will be lots of nursery rhyme themed activities for the children to have a go at:

- Monday – Incy Wincy Spider
- Tuesday – Humpty Dumpty
- Wednesday – When I Was One
- Thursday – I Hear Thunder
- Friday – Two Little Dickie Birds

On Tuesday, we will join the rest of the school for the Remembrance service on the common. Parents are welcome to join us for the service but children will need to stay with their class.

This week we are learning:

Phonics – we are learning the sounds h, b, f, ff, l, ll & ss and the tricky words ‘into’ & ‘her’.

Maths – we are learning about the number 6. We are using ladybirds to learn number bonds for 6, will be learning about hexagons and will be using natural resources to count 6 objects.

Jigsaw – we are talking about what makes us special. We will learning that it’s good to be unique and that we can help each other with whatever we are good at.

Music – we will be continuing to practice songs for our nativity. This year we will be performing ‘The Twinkly Nativity’.

Other – each day this week we will be looking at different nursery rhymes.
